


A Book of Poems




**Jim Flores Bad Cop; Inspired by True Events** Published April 20, 2022

### Laurie Finucane Shadow Street: A Memoir of Escaping a Psychopath Published August 12, 2022


Trapped. Married to a psychopath. Can she escape to a better life?

multiply when the couple moves to the house on Shadow Street. Finally, after thirteen years of marriage, events align that set the stage for her escape.


